

Psalm 1

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and into your life.

Please read Psalm 1. As you read, pay attention to the verbs in the Psalm and write down what the Lord speaks to your heart.

Contrast the godly from the ungodly. What are they each like?

Godly:

Ungodly:

Look at verse 6:b: What happens to the ungodly?

Look at verse 1: What are you as a believer not to do?

It is so important who you take counsel from. Think on when you have received counsel and where have received it: The world or from God? What steps will you take to seek counsel from God if you have never done so before? What steps will you keep taking to ensure that you will stay in the counsel of God?

New Testament application: Read Colossians 3:16, 2 Timothy 3:15, Luke 11:28, Revelation 22:14.

When you read the applications, think on Psalm 1 and all that God is showing you.

Remember to look at and do Sunday's applications!

Psalm 2

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read and Study Psalm 2 on your own. Ask the Holy Spirit to show you a verse that ministers to you. When studying, think about **why** this verse spoke to you and **how** you will apply it to your life. Write down your thoughts below.

New Testament application: Find verses in the New Testament that correlate with the verse the Holy Spirit showed you. Use blueletterbible.org to find your verse and click on the cross references to find verses that correlate with the verse you chose. Write down what Jesus shows you.

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Psalm 3

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 3.

We are going to study verses 3-4 today.

Look up the word **shield** in a dictionary. Webster's 1828 dictionary gives great definitions for words. Write down the definition and how God has been your shield. Use examples/experiences from your life.

Read these verses: Genesis 15:1, 2 Samuel 22:3, 31, Psalm 18:30, 28:7, 33:20. Write down what God shows you.

The second part of verse 3 says that God lifts up the Psalmist's head. Think of a time when you were downcast and how the Lord used His word to lift up your head? Write down the verse and how it ministered to your heart.

The Lord is always listening to us. He hears us when we are doing normal everyday things and when we are on our knees crying out to Him. Prayer is so important in our lives as believers. **Don't neglect prayer.** Take time right now to sit before the Lord and talk with Him. Or if you need to cry out to Him about something, do that now. Write your prayer here.

New Testament application: Read Luke 18:1-8, John 9:31, 1 John 5:14. Write down what God shows you.

Remember to look at and do Sunday's applications!

Psalm 4

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 4. Write down what the Lord is speaking to you.

Look at verse 4 (NKJV). There are 3 commands given to us in verse 4. Write them down.

Use blueletterbible.org/ or a concordance to find verses that go with the words below.

How does the Bible instruct you in the following areas? Write down after each verse the instruction given to you. Then look up the definition of each word in the dictionary and write it down.

Anger:

New Testament Application: Read Ephesians 4:26, Philippians 4:8, Mark 6:31. Write down what the Lord speaks to your heart.

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Psalm 5

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 5. Write down the verse the Lord is speaking to your heart. What is He showing you?

Look at verse 11. What 3 things in this verse cause rejoicing or joy in your life?

Look up the definitions of joy and rejoice and write them down. Webster's 1828 dictionary online gives great definitions for words.

Today, as you walk in daily life, make a point to trust and love the Lord in situations that come your way. Put verse 11 into practice today. The Bible tells you not to only be hearer of the word but a doer of it (James 1:22). What steps will you take today to put God's word into practice?

New Testament application: Read John 15:10-11, Romans 15:13, Galatians 5:22, Colossians 1:9-12, Philippians 4:4, 1 Thessalonians 5:16, 1 Peter 1:6-9. Write down what the Lord shows you through these verses.

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Psalm 6

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 6. In verse 2 the Psalmist speaks of weakness.

Look up the definition of weakness. Webster's 1828 dictionary on line gives great definitions of words. Write it down.

Weakness is not something we always talk about in our Christian walk. With humility, the Psalmist had come to realize the mere humanness of his weakness. When we actually take into account how weak we truly are, we turn our hearts to the Lord and say "O Lord" as the Psalmist did in verse 2

Take time right now to pray and tell the Lord of your weaknesses. Sit and be still and let Him search your heart. There may be some weaknesses you are not even aware of. Write them down and give them over to the Lord so you can be strengthened in the Lord today.

New Testament Application: 2 Corinthians 12:9. Study this verse using your concordance or blueletterbible.org. Read commentaries on this verse. Read different versions of the Bible for this verse. Write down what the Lord teaches you.

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Psalm 7

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 7.

What is God showing you?

How will you put this into practice today?

Write a praise to the Lord for what He is doing in your life.

Write a prayer to the Lord just as David did in this Psalm. Whatever He puts on your heart, it doesn't have to be just like David's prayer.

New Testament Application: 1 Thessalonians 5:17, Romans 15:11, Hebrews 2:12, Revelation 19:5

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Psalm 8

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 8.

Magnify the Lord in your heart today. Write down your praise!!!

God's glory is all over this Psalm. Look up verses about God's glory in your Thompson Chain 1426 or in blueletterbible.org by typing in God's glory. Read through a few verses and write down what God is speaking to your heart.

New Testament Application: 2 Corinthians 3:18, Revelation 4. Write down what God shows you.

Remember to look at and do Sunday's applications!

Psalm 9

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 9.

Write down a marvelous work the Lord has done in your life recently.

Put on one of your favorite worship songs and take time to worship the Lord now. You can even do more songs if you would like.

Write about a time the Lord was your refuge. What did He do for you or what did he require you to do?

Look up in your Thompson Chain 2886 or blueletterbible.org or your concordance for promises for seekers.

New Testament Application: Luke 8:24 (Refuge) Luke 11:19, John 14:14, James 4:8 (Seekers)

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Psalm 10

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 10.

Write down what the Lord is speaking to you through this Psalm. When the Holy Spirit has you focus on a verse in this Psalm, spend time with Him and pray and ask what He wants to show you.

New Testament Application: Find New Testament verses that go along with what the Lord spoke to you through this Psalm and write them down.

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Psalm 11

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 11

Study heaven and God's throne: What is it going to be like? Read Revelation 21 and 22. Write down your thoughts and also other verses that you find in your study. Thompson Chain 1356.

Study Righteousness: What does it mean? Look it up in a dictionary. (A good source is Webster's 1828 online)

Write down what the Lord speaks to your heart about this Psalm. How will you put it into practice?

New Testament Application: Romans 1:17, 1 John 2:29, John 14

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Psalm 12

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 12.

Write down what God shows you.

How will you put that into practice today?

New Testament Application: With what the Lord showed you, find a New Testament application using your concordance, blueletterbible.org or your Thompson Chain. Write down the references and put the Word of God into practice!!!

Remember to look at and do Sunday's applications!

Psalm 13

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 13.

Look up the word mercy in the dictionary. Webster's 1828 dictionary is a great source and so is blueletterbible.org

What does it mean?

Give examples in scripture of what mercy looks like. Thinking of people in the Bible tell what happened and how they received mercy? You can use blueletterbible.org.

Think of a time when you received mercy from the Lord. Write down what happened.

Ponder on the Salvation that you have received from God and thank Him in a meaningful prayer.

Put on Worship music and spend a few minutes worshiping to the Lord. Let the Lord refresh your soul.

New Testament Application: Luke 1:50, Ephesians 2:4, Titus 3:2, Luke 1:47, I Timothy 4:10, Rev 19:1

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Psalm 14

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 14.

Pray for those that you know that either reject God or don't believe in Him. Write down their names. Get on your knees and pray for them today.

Have the Lord search your heart today to show you the sin in your life. This comes from verse 3. Repent of your sin and allow the Lord to cleanse you. Write them down. You will be the only one seeing this.

From this Psalm, What does God teach you?

New Testament Application: Romans 3:23 Remember we fall short, 1 Thessalonians 5:17,

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Psalm 15

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 15.

Write the 11 answers to the question asked in verse 1

What happens to the person who does these things?

Pick one of these answers and put it into practice today. Write down which one you chose.

Pick one of the following and study it in the scriptures. ie: backbiting, fear of the Lord, truthful speaking.
What are your instructions?

New Testament Application: Titus 3:2, James 4:11, Acts 28:10, Philippians 2:29 (this goes with verse 4),
Romans 15:2, 13:10, Galatians 5:14

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Psalm 16

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 16.

Pray verses 1, 2, 5 for yourself.

Thank the Lord for the saints. Write down the names of specific people.

Take time to bless the Lord for all that He has done in your life: the guidance He has given, the correction He has given, the love that He has given. Write down your prayer.

What does the Psalmist do in verse 8a?

Why does He do it? 8b

What happens to the Psalmist because of God? 8c

Verse 9 has a “therefore” to start the verse. Go back and read why his heart rejoices and is glad. Write down what God shows you.

Study verse 11. Look up verses that show you the right path. Thompson Chain 2688 or use blueletterbible.org.

Verse 11 has a promise of joy for being in God’s presence. We will one day get to be with Him for eternity. Spend time in His presence today.

New Testament Application: Colossians 3:2, Matthew 28:20, Revelation 21:3, Luke 23:43, John 12:26

Remember to look at and do Sunday's applications!

Psalm 17

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 17.

Take time to pray to the Lord whatever is on your heart. Ask Him to give ear to your prayer.

Study God's loving kindness.

What is love?

What is kindness?

As you look at verse 7, why and how is it love from God? You may need to read the previous verses for context.

Write down all that the Lord showed you through this Psalm.

New Testament Application: Titus 3:4-7, Believe the promise in this verse today!!!

Remember to look at and do Sunday's applications!

Psalm 18

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 18.

What verse spoke to your heart today and why?

What are you going to do today to apply that verse to your life? Come back later today and write how the Lord used that verse in your life.

What promises do you find in this Psalm?

Give thanks to Lord

Find your favorite worship song/s and sing to Him!!

New Testament Application: Write down New Testament verses that go with the verse the Lord spoke to you.

Remember to look at and do Sunday's applications!

Psalm 19

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 19.

Focus on verses 7-11

The phrase "of the Lord" is used in verses 7-9. Write down the 6 words that come before the phrase.

Then write down the 7 words that come after the phrase "of the Lord".

Write down the 6 attributes ie: converting the soul verse 7....

Ponder verse 10 and 11 and write what God shows you.

Spend time allowing the Lord to search your heart and repent of your sin. This comes from verse 12-13.
Pray these verses. Read Psalm 139:23-24.

Study verse 14. What did God show you?

New Testament Application: Ephesians 4:29, 2 Timothy 2:15,

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Psalm 20

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 20.

Look at verses 1-4. Pray these for yourself and also pray for the women here in Fargo. Don't be general, actually say the person's name and then pray the verses for them.

Remember God: Look up these verses and write down what God shows you.

Nehemiah 4:14

Psalm 78:35

Jonah 2:7

Psalm 63:6

Ponder events in your life and remember how God was there for you. Write them down and be encouraged.

New Testament Application: 1 Thessalonians 5:17, James 5:16,

Remember to look at and do Sunday's applications!

Psalm 21

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 21.

Write down what God shows you .

Find a verse that stands out to you and see what God wants to speak to you through it. Write down what He shows you. Cross reference it with other verses. Write down the verses.

Exalt God in your heart. Take time to do this now.

New Testament Application: 1 Corinthians 15:28 (God exalted)

Remember to look at and do Sunday's applications!

Psalm 22

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 22.

This Psalm is a Messianic Psalm which means that it speaks of Jesus.

Read Isaiah 53. Write down what God shows you.

New Testament Application: Write down what God shows you for each passage of scripture.

Read Matthew 27:27-66.

Read Mark 15:16-47

Read Luke 23:26-56

Read John 19:17-42

Remember to look at and do Sunday's applications!

Psalm 23

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 23.

Pay attention to the verbs in verses 2-3. Write down what the Lord does for you.

God does these things all for what? Look at the end of verse 3.

Your life should be full of peace. If you have lost your peace, go back to God and walk in these truths that He is declaring to you in this Psalm. Write down where you have strayed to lose your peace. The Lord wants to lead and restore you. Let the Lord search your heart and get right with the Lord so you can have peace.

Look at verses 4-6. Write down what God speaks to your heart through these verses.

Pray and seek the Lord as to which verse really ministers to your heart and write down why it strengthens you.

New Testament Application: Take the verse that ministered to you and use your concordance to find other verses in the New Testament to go along with that verse.

Remember to look at and do Sunday's applications!

Psalm 24

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 24.

Sit with the Lord today and go to His Holy Hill.

Get your hands clean and your heart pure. This means to repent of your sins.

What idols do you have getting in the way of your relationship with God? Think of an idol as anything that you spend a lot of time on or takes you away from God. It is time to clean house in your heart!! Take account of these idols , write them down, and make a decision to get them out of your life. Cross them off!!!

Lift up the King of Kings and Lord of Lords in your heart today.

Worship through song

New Testament Application: (access to God) John 14:6, Ephesians 2:18, Matthew 5:8, 1 Timothy 1:5,

1 Peter 1:22

Remember to look at and do Sunday's applications!

Psalm 25

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 25.

Study verses 4-5 and write down the ways of God.

In what ways has God taught you? Think of recent things that He has been teaching you.

In what ways has God led you? Think of recent things He is leading you in.

Pray verses 4-5 for your life.

Read the rest of the Psalm and write what the Lord speaks to your heart.

New Testament Application: Revelation 15:3, Pray and ask the Lord for a verse that speaks to your heart from this Psalm and cross reference verses in the New Testament. Write down your verse here.

Remember to look at and do Sunday's applications!

Psalm 26

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 26.

Write out a prayer of thanksgiving to the Lord.

Study integrity.

What does it mean?

Find a Bible character who had integrity and list his/her attributes.

What does the Lord show you about your life concerning integrity?

Glorify God in your heart. Pray Isaiah 6:3, 1 Chronicles 29:11, Revelation 4:11, 7:10, 15:3-4, 19:1

Write what the Lord shows you through this Psalm.

New Testament Application: 2 Corinthians 7:2, Hebrews 13:18 (integrity),

Remember to look at and do Sunday's applications!

Psalm 27

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 27.

Get out your worship music and worship with a few songs.

Seek the Lord's face today and ask Him what He wants to talk to you about. Wait on Him and write down what He is showing you. Write down how you were strengthened.

Verse 9 speaks of God not leaving you nor forsaking you. Read the following verses and be encouraged.

Deuteronomy 4:31, 31:6, Joshua 1:5, Psalm 121:8, Isaiah 41:17-21, 42:16, 44:21, 46:4, 49:15, 54:10,

Write down what God has personally shown you through this Psalm. Spend time with Him.

New Testament Application: John 13:1,, 14:18, Hebrews 13:5

Remember to look at and do Sunday's applications!

Psalm 28

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 28.

What is supplication? Look up the definition and write it down.

Go before the Lord with your supplications as David did. Take time to write them down in your prayer journal for today.

God does listen to your prayers and He does help you. Look up these verses and write down what God speaks to your heart.

2 Kings 6:27

Psalm 40:7

Isaiah 41:10

Read verse 7 again. There is a “therefore” in the verse; go back and write down why David’s heart rejoices and praises God.

What specific verse did God speak to you in this Psalm. Write it down and explain why.

New Testament Application: Hebrews 13:6, Philippians 4:4

Remember to look at and do Sunday's applications!

Psalm 29

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 29.

Reread and do verses 1 and 2

What does the voice of the Lord do in verses 3-9. One word answers are cool.

Read 1 Kings 19

Go back and ponder on the answers you wrote. Your God is Mighty!!!!

Go to verse 11 and study the peace of God promised to you as a Believer. Thompson Chain 3013. You can also go to blueletterbible.org and type in Psalm 29: go to verse 11, click on the C and study the verses.

Write down a time where the Lord has strengthened you and given you His peace.

New Testament Application: John 4:23-24, Matthew 17:5, John 14:27, 16:33, Philippians 4:6-7

Remember to look at and do Sunday's applications!

Psalm 30

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 30.

James 1:22 says to be a doer of the Word.

Put into practice verbs in verses 1-4, 8-10.

Write down how the Lord ministered to you as you sought to be a doer of the word.

What areas of your life do you need God to help you? Write them down and ask for His mercy in those areas.

What things are weighing heavy on your heart. This comes from verse 11-12. Write them down and give them over to the Lord. Start dancing and be glad!!! You could literally dance around with joy!!! 😊

Thank the Lord for all He has done for today.

New Testament Application: James 1:22, Find verses in the New Testament that go along with the verbs that ministered to you the most. Write them down

Remember to look at and do Sunday's applications!

Psalm 31

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 31.

Write down what the Lord speaks to you through this Psalm.

Look at verse 23

Where are you at with your love for the Lord?

Read these verses and write what God shows you.

Deuteronomy 6:5

Deuteronomy 10:12

Deuteronomy 11:1

Joshua 22:5

Matthew 22:37

New Testament Application: 2 Thessalonians 3:5, Jude 1:21

Remember to look at and do Sunday's applications!

Psalm 32

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 32.

Let the Lord search your heart today and confess your sin to Him. He is ready to forgive. Verse 5

Draw unto the Lord through prayer. Verse 6

Read verse 8. Ask the Lord to instruct you today in what He desires you to do. Write down your instructions.

As you read this Psalm, what verse spoke to you the most and why?

New Testament Application: 1 John 1:9, 1 Thessalonians 4:9, 1 John 2:27

Remember to look at and do Sunday's applications!

Psalm 33

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 33.

Give the Lord the Praise due His name.

Are you waiting on the Lord for something? Write it down.

What promises has He given you from the word? Write them down.

What are the promises given to us as we wait for Him to come back to get us. Look up references and write down the ones that speak to your heart most.

Read Acts 1:4-8. Write what God shows you.

Have you been baptized with the Spirit?

Have you been refilled lately?

Wait on God to do this for you today. Ask Him and He will do it.

Trust God to work in the things that you are asking Him for spiritually. A lot of times we can think of the earthly things that we desire.

New Testament Application: Luke 2:25

Remember to look at and do Sunday's applications!

Psalm 34

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 34.

In verses 1-14 write down verses that the Lord speaks to your heart and why. What is God teaching you?

The phrase the Lord is... is used many times in verses 15-22. There are comforting words in these verses for us as we go through trials. Take each verse and write down what the Lord does for you and the outcome of His doing.

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 35.

Thank Jesus for your Salvation today.

Write definition of Salvation.

Read these verses on Salvation. Write down anything the Lord speaks to your heart about these verses.

Exodus 14:13

1 Samuel 2:1

Isaiah 12:2

Zephaniah 3:17

This whole Psalm is about The Lord being an avenger for His people.

In Romans chapter 12 God tells us that vengeance is His. Go read Chapter 12.

David has a heart after God to seek Him in prayer and let Him take care of matters and not David himself.

Are there things that you are taking into your own hands that you need to give over to the Lord? Think of anything, not just things being done to you. What are you holding onto? Submit it to the Lord and let Him take care of you. Write down what you are holding onto.

New Testament Application: 1Timothy 4:10, Revelation 19:1

Remember to look at and do Sunday's applications!

Psalm 36

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 36.

The beginning of the Psalm talks of the wicked. What does God's word say about the wicked? V 1-4

In verses 5-9 we see God's character. Write down what God shows you as you read and ponder these verses.

Pray verses 10-11 for your life.

New Testament Application: 1 Corinthians 1:9, Titus 3:4-5, Romans 1:17

Remember to look at and do Sunday's applications!

Psalm 37

Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to teach you all He wants you to receive into your heart and your life.

Read Psalm 37.

This Psalm has so many gems in it; wonderful instruction for you as a Christian.

Read verses 1-8. Let the Lord minister to your heart. Which verse is He speaking to you about? Write down all that He wants to teach you about that verse. Study it out. Receive it into your heart. Put it into practice.

Look at verses 23-24. The Lord takes care of His children. Read the verses below and write down what encouragement you receive from them.

Read Psalm 39.
